On July 1st, 1905 at Pinoli's Restaurant in London, where some twenty-three amateur and professional magicians were present, The Magic Circle was born. The meeting was the result of prodigious work by an enthusiastic amateur Neil Weaver, and it was during the course of a debate regarding a name for the proposed society that Louis Nikola, a great inventor-magician, with unconscious inspiration suggested "The Magic Circle".

October 3rd of the same year, Britain's greatest magician, David Devant became the first President and as a mark of generosity he offered his collection of books as a nucleus of a library.

Since that date The Magic Circle has collected virtually every book or publication printed on the subject of Magic. Today it has the finest collection of books on Magic in the world. Members borrow these books as works of reference to help them invent new tricks . . . or simply find out how to do some of the older ones.

But if you think "knowing how to do the tricks" is the most important thing, you'd be wrong. You've got hours and hours (sometimes years) of practice ahead of you before you can present it skilfully enough to deceive anyone. That's the real secret. Practice and more practice.

You'll be seeing the results of that practice in abundance tonight from the world's top magic acts.

So sit back, relax and be prepared to be deceived . . .
